Students will identify and explore careers that are a good match for their skills and strengths.

Suggestions for Differentiation:	Discussion:
If students think that their careers do not match their interests, have them click on Change Answers on the Careers page. They should review some of their answers and change them.	Discuss what students learned about careers that match their skill sets. Ask them to talk about careers that interest them, including education required and job outlook. If they dig deeper on a career, they can look at current job postings for the career.
The Skills Matcher website can be presented in Spanish. The button in the top right corner will change the website to Spanish.	Ask students to share a career they did not know about that matches their skill set. Discuss why information about whether a field is growing could be important.
