Objective:

Suggestions for Differentiation:	Discussion:
If students think that their careers do not match their interests, have them click on Change Answers on the Careers page. They should review some of their answers and change them.	Ask students to share a career they did not know about that matches their interests. Discuss why information about whether a field is growing could be important. Ask if anyone found a career that might interest them.
The Interest Survey website can be presented in Spanish. The button in the top right corner will change the website to Spanish.	Ask students to compare the careers that match interests with the careers that match their skills. Which assessment revealed the most careers that might interest them?
