

Understanding Individual Education Plan Reviews

Course Description

This course is designed for classroom teachers or other educators who need to understand what an Individual Education Plan is, what to look for when reviewing one, and how it is designed to promote success of students with disabilities. Whether an educator is on an IEP Team, or simply helping to support a student for success, understanding the critical components of an IEP is useful. The course also introduces the Universal Design for Learning (UDL) and illustrates how to review a lesson plan, and modify it to include more supportive elements.
